What is this Product?

The Fund is a sub fund of a non UCITS open ended investment company and there is no fixed term or maturity date. Fund launch date: 27/07/2001.

Objective and Policy

The objective is to seek to provide a regular income from a managed portfolio of sterling fixed interest securities with a particular emphasis on those securities on which interest is paid gross to non-residents of the United Kingdom.

The policy is to invest in securities issued by governments, local authorities, public utilities and corporations. If it appears advisable to hold assets having a short term maturity, then the Fund may also place money on bank deposit (subject to certain limitations).


If interest rates rise, the fixed income earned from bonds (fixed interest securities) becomes less attractive to investors, so the demand for bonds may fall and their capital value may decrease. Bonds may be affected by changes in interest rates, inflation and any decline in the creditworthiness of the issuer.

This Fund may be suitable for you if you are willing to risk a loss to your capital and are looking for a medium to long term investment.

The Fund can be terminated without the agreement of shareholders, if the value of the Fund is less than £5,000,000 or currency equivalent for a period of four consecutive weeks. Shareholders will be given at least three weeks' written notice of any such action.

What are the risks and what could I get in return?

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk and volatility of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or the type of underlying assets in which the Fund invests.



The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for a minimum of five years.

The actual risk can vary significantly if you sell your shares at an early stage and you may get back less.

We have classified this product as 2, which is a low risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a low level, and poor market conditions are very unlikely to impact the amount you could get back.

The base currency of the Fund is sterling. The return from investing in a fund denominated in a currency other than the currency of your residence or domicile may be affected by currency fluctuations. Dividends are not guaranteed and the amount you receive may fluctuate.

What are the risks and what could I get in return? (continued)

What happens if Lloyds Investment Fund Managers Limited is unable to pay out?

In the event of the default of the manager or custodian of the Fund, limited protection is provided under the Collective Investment Funds (Recognized Funds) (Compensation for Investors) (Jersey) Regulations, 1988. The maximum amount of compensation payable to any one investor is £48,000, but is subject to the total amount of compensation in any one year being limited to £5,000,000.

What are the costs?

The Reduction in Yield (RIY) shows what impact the total costs you pay will have on the investment return you might get. The total costs take into account one-off, ongoing and incidental costs. The amounts shown here are the cumulative costs of the product itself, for three different holding periods. The figures assume you invest £10,000. The figures are estimates and may change in the future.
